Remote Learning for KS3 Pupils – Staying Safe

- During periods of self-isolation you will be expected to log onto Google Classroom to engage in remote learning.
- If you are an individual who is self-isolating you need to access remote learning work through your individual Google Classrooms. This will be provided before 11am on the first day of your isolation. If you are part of a whole bubble who is self-isolating you will be expected to engage in live learning via Google Meets.
- When working from home you will log onto Google Classroom at 8:30am to meet with your tutor via Google Meets. The register will be taken and you will do form time activities.
- For live lessons you will follow your timetable, starting with Period 1 at 8:50am and attend live lessons with your teachers via Google Classroom and Meet. Each teacher will take a register. At the end of the lesson you will need to access your next lesson via Google Classroom or have a break (10:45-11am) or lunch (1-1:45pm). It is important to stick to these times as the lessons are being delivered live and your attendance is monitored by your Head of Year.
- For non-live remote learning it is advised you use your timetable as a guide in terms of managing your day and the amount of time you spend on your classwork.
- If you do not log into both form and lesson sessions your Head of Year will ring home.
- You do not need to wear your uniform on the days you are learning at home, but you must wear appropriate clothing as you will be visible to your teacher. No pyjamas!
- You can turn the video off when taking part in a task. You must have the video on at the beginning of the lesson and when answering questions. Teachers can mute you unless you are asked to speak.
- Log on from a shared space in your house (not your bedroom). Make sure that no-one else in your home can be seen in the video during lessons.
- Lessons may be recorded and the chat saved
- Any inappropriate behaviour or comments will be managed the same as they would in school.
- If you are struggling to log on due to technology or internet issues you must ensure your parents call the school or Head of Year to inform them.
- You should be using a laptop/computer to log on and NOT a mobile phone. Chromebooks can be loaned from school.
