Remote Learning for KS4 Pupils – Staying Safe

- During periods of self-isolation you will be expected to log onto Google Classroom to engage in remote learning.
- If you are an **individual** who is self-isolating you need to access remote learning work through your individual Google Classrooms. This will be provided before 11am on the first day of your isolation. If you are part of a **whole bubble** who is self-isolating you will be expected to engage in live learning via Google Meets.
- When working from home you need to log onto Google Classroom at 8:30am and meet your tutor via Google Meets. The register will be taken and you will do form time activities.
- For live lessons you will follow your normal timetable timing. These will be delivered through Google Classroom and Google Meets for each subject.
- If you do not log into both form and lesson sessions your Head of Year will ring home.
- For non-live remote learning it is advised you use your timetable as a guide in terms of managing your day and the amount of time you spend on your classwork.
- We don't know if in the future teachers may again need to assess pupils GCSE grades as they have this year. It is really important that you take responsibility to complete all set work, as this will enable teachers to fairly assess your work if required by exam boards.
- As you are now in Key Stage 4, you should also be taking responsibility to complete additional work outside of school time.
- You do not need to wear your uniform on the days you are learning at home, but you do need to wear appropriate clothing as you will be visible to your teacher, so no pyjamas.
- You can turn the video off when taking part in a task. You must have it on at the beginning of the lesson and when answering questions. Teachers can mute you unless you are asked to speak.
- Log on from a shared space in your house (not your bedroom). Make sure that no-one else is visible in the video during lessons.
- Lessons may be recorded and the chat saved.
- Any inappropriate behaviour or comments will be managed the same as they would in school.
- If you are struggling to log on due to technology or internet issues you must ensure your parents call the school or Head of Year to inform them.
- You should be using a laptop/chromebook to log on and NOT a mobile phone. Chromebooks can be loaned from school.
